TOP 10 SCIENTISTS OF INDIA



A.P.J. Abdul Kalam - The Missile Man

Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam was not only a great scientist but also the 11th President of India. He worked with India's space and missile programs and played a big role in making India self-reliant in defense technology. He was loved by students for his kind nature and inspiring speeches. He believed that children are the future of India and always encouraged them to study science.



C.V. Raman - The Light Explorer

C.V. Raman was a famous Indian physicist who discovered something amazing about light. He found out that when light passes through a transparent material, it changes slightly. This is called the Raman Effect. He was the first Indian to win the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1930. Raman's discovery helped scientists understand how light behaves, and his work is still used in labs today.



Homi J. Bhabha - Father of Nuclear Science in India

Homi Jehangir Bhabha was the scientist behind India's nuclear program. He believed that atomic energy could help India progress. He founded the Tata Institute of Fundamental Research and the Bhabha Atomic Research Centre. Thanks to his work, India began using nuclear energy for electricity, medicine, and more. His dream helped India become a strong science-powered country.



Vikram Sarabhai - Father of the Indian Space Program

Vikram Sarabhai is the reason we have ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation) today. He believed that space technology could help solve India's problems. Because of him, India launched its first satellite Aryabhata and began its journey into space. He wanted India to use satellites for communication, education, and weather forecasting.



Jagadish Chandra Bose - Scientist Who Talked to Plants

Jagadish Chandra Bose was a scientist who showed that plants can feel pain and respond to their surroundings. He also made early discoveries in radio waves before other scientists. He invented instruments to measure plant reactions. His work was so advanced that he is known as one of the earliest Indian science pioneers in plant and radio research.

Satyendra Nath Bose - The Brain Behind the Boson

Satyendra Nath Bose worked with Albert Einstein on quantum physics. Together, they created the Bose-Einstein statistics, which explain how tiny particles behave at very low temperatures. A new type of particle called the boson was named after him. His ideas helped in the creation of advanced physics theories and even the discovery of the Higgs boson, known as the "God particle."



Srinivasa Ramanujan - The Number Wizard

Srinivasa Ramanujan was a math genius with very little formal training. He made important contributions to number theory, algebra, and mathematical analysis. Even today, his formulas and discoveries are studied by mathematicians all over the world. He showed that great minds can come from any background and hard work can lead to greatness.



Meghnad Saha - The Star Scientist

Meghnad Saha was an Indian astrophysicist. He created the Saha Ionization Equation, which explains how stars shine and produce light. His equation is used by scientists to study stars and space. He helped make India proud in the world of astronomy and Indian scientists and their inventions.



G.D. Naidu - The Indian Edison

G.D. Naidu was an inventor who created many machines and gadgets. He is known as the "Edison of India" because of his amazing inventions in engineering and mechanics. He built the first electric motor in India and even made a petrol engine. His work helped in making India's industries stronger and smarter.



Salim Ali - The Birdman of India

Dr. Salim Ali was a scientist who loved birds. He studied their behavior and wrote books about Indian birds. Thanks to his work, India started protecting forests and wildlife. His research helped build awareness about nature, and he is remembered as one of the greatest famous Indian scientists in the field of zoology.

Guidelines for Parents and Guardians

1. Kindly ensure that your ward comes in proper school uniform carrying the required books and note books regularly.
2. Almanac should be checked and signed daily.
3. Help him/her prepare well for the tests and exams.
4. Encourage him/her to actively participate in extracurricular activities and sports.
5. No student is allowed to leave the school during the working hours without the prior written permission. Keep leave for half day to a minimal size as far as possible. In case a student leaves the school early, it is mandatory to inform the Class Incharge as well as Bus Incharge for the same.
6. Keep the school updated about any change in address and/or telephone numbers.
7. Any correspondence with the teacher/s concerned should be made through the school almanac.
8. Do not criticise or condemn the teachers or school before your ward. Encourage your ward to develop a healthy attitude towards the community and the nation.
9. The school would like you to maintain a close rapport with the teachers for better understanding and co-operation.
10. Besides PTSM, you can approach teacher/s having taken prior appointment.
11. Do visit school website from time to time to get acquainted with the latest information.
12. Restrict celebration of birthday of your ward in school to simple distribution of toffees in their respective classes only. Elaborate arrangements like cake cutting, partying in the classroom etc. are not permitted. **Only students of classes I-V are permitted to wear casuals on their birthday, if they so desire.**
13. In any urgent situation, parents are informed through SMS/Whatsapp groups on mobile number registered with the school.
14. Monitor the internet sites being visited by your ward and limit his/her television viewing to appropriate programmes and to a minimal duration.

Transport Facility & Attendance Policy

Transport facility is available for all the students from Nursery to Class XII from every part of the city. The code of conduct drafted in this region should be observed by one and all. Any student, if found guilty, is liable to be debarred from commuting by the school bus.

"Absences add up ! Missing just two days a month means you miss 10% of the school year."

1. It is compulsory for all the students to maintain at least 75 % attendance in an academic session to be eligible to appear for the examination. In case attendance is short, the student is not entitled to take the exam and would be debarred from promotion/any academic award.
2. The student must get the leave sanctioned from the class teacher well in advance. For more than three days leave, he/she should get it sanctioned from the Principal.
3. Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than ten consecutive days would amount to the name struck off from the rolls. Readmission may be granted only on the payment of admission fee afresh.
4. Students must attend the school on the day after and before any vacation respectively.
5. A child returning to school after recovering from an infectious or contagious disease should present a medical certificate from a doctor certifying his/her fitness.
6. Appreciation certificates will be awarded to the students for maintaining 100% attendance throughout the academic session.

Scholar Badge Award Criteria

Scholar Badge Award is given to a student from classes IV - XI who is enlisted in the 'Merit List' of the class (including all sections). The criteria for selection of scholar badge awards is as follows-

- He/She should have scored **90%** marks or above in aggregate along with at least **85%** marks in each subject
- He/She should have at least **80%** attendance in class and should have taken all examinations as per rules of the school
- For class XI, top **20%** students from all the sections, subject to a minimum of **85%** marks will be awarded Scholar Badge

To be eligible for the Scholar Badge, students must appear in all examinations. However, in case of a medical emergency, relaxation will be granted only if the medical leave (ML) is certified by the Chief Medical Officer (CMO).



Code of Conduct

"Discipline is bridge between goals and accomplishment."

1. Students must be respectful to their school mates and the members of staff.
2. During school hours, students are expected to communicate in English only.
3. Students must not indulge in any act that may tarnish the image of the school.
4. Students must keep the school campus clean.
5. Observe discipline in the bus.
6. Do not run to board the bus but walk in a queue.
7. Do not board or alight from a moving bus, for it is dangerous.
8. Do not scramble when you board or alight from the bus.
9. Do not stretch your head or any body part out of the bus.
10. Co-operate with the staff on duty and abide by the instructions given by them from time to time.
11. Never stand in front of or behind a stationary bus.
12. The buses will not wait for late comers.
13. Buses will drop the students at their mentioned stops only. In case of any change or emergency, parents are requested to take permission in writing in advance.
14. Throwing wrappers, peels, shells etc. out of window is strictly prohibited.
15. Children should stand about ten feet away from the main road until the bus arrives.
16. Students should refrain from leaving their seats unless the bus comes to a halt.
17. Students should not use profane or indecent language in the bus or elsewhere.
18. **Students U-18 are strictly prohibited to use any social media platform (Facebook/Twitter/Instagram/ Snapchat etc.). If such a case comes into our cognizance, disciplinary action will be taken against the student.**
19. Don't do anything which may distract the driver's attention.
20. Any inconvenience/irregularity should first be reported to the Transport In-charge personally or telephonically on 92541-81420.

Banned Items

The following items which may be harmful or cause distraction should not be brought to the school:

- Any Potential Weapon, Drug and Drug Related Items (unless medically prescribed with proof provided), Untoward Pictures, Books, Magazines etc., Jewellery & Accessories, Firecrackers, Lighter or Matchbox, Chewing Gum, Mobile Phone, CD, I-Pod, Pen-Drive, Tablet, Laptop, Smart Watches etc., Blade, Cutter, Knife etc., Soft Drinks/ Aerated Drinks/ Packet Food/ Junk Food.

School Bulletins

To encourage creative expressions, children with a flair for writing are given an opportunity to contribute their articles, poems and sketches in the News Bulletins, Annual School Magazine and Anthology of Poems. Genuine and Original Compositions of students will find due space.

Library

"Reading is to the mind what exercise is to the body."

The School Library is open to all bonafide students of the school during school hours. All classes are provided with at least one period each for library and language lab per week.

The following points underline the code of conduct to be observed:

1. Library books will be issued to the students for seven days only.
2. Reference books, magazines and periodical publications are to be read in the library only. These books are not meant to be issued.
3. Students must come to the library in a disciplined manner and observe good conduct as required while sitting in the library.
4. The Library has an open shelf system and students must put the books back in organised & systematic manner in the respective shelves.
5. Any child found damaging or defacing a book will be debarred from using the library for some time which may be extended to the whole academic year.
6. Books marked, disfigured or damaged will have to be replaced or paid for by the borrower.

Language Lab

1. The languages are taught through audio-visual methods based on smart class programmes.
2. In language lab, students are given exposure to listening, reading and speaking skills through audio-visual modes under the guidance of Language Experts.
3. Students must maintain discipline in Language Lab. Any tampering with the equipment will invite stringent penalty.



Parent-Teacher-Student Association

Parent - Teacher - Student Association is strengthened from time to time through regular PTSM. It gives an opportunity to the parents and teachers to interact with each other and to discuss the progress of the learners. The suggestions and ideas from the parent community are considered with an open mind to enhance the academic excellence.

PTSM for the session will tentatively be observed in May, August, October, December & February

Withdrawal of Student from School

1. If a child is to be withdrawn from school, parents are required to give one month notice in writing, failing which, fee for one month will be charged in lieu thereof. The exemption may be made in case of sudden transfer of Government Employee and Military Personnel.
2. Transfer certificate for the child withdrawn is issued only when all the dues are cleared.
3. Students may be asked to leave the school on the following grounds:
 - a) Indiscipline
 - b) Unsatisfactory Progress in Academics
 - c) Detention in a Class
4. A student who fails twice in the same class will not be permitted to continue his/her studies in the school.

Sick Bay

The school has a medical room where in case of any emergency, first-aid is provided during school hours under the supervision of a full time qualified paramedic. Besides, a periodical medical checkup of every student is ascertained and a record of his/her health is maintained. The parents are informed if it is found that a child needs some special medical attention.

All parents are requested to impart Health Education to their children and see to it that they:

1. maintain personal hygiene like taking bath everyday, paring of nails and being neat in their turn out.
2. exercise regularly.
3. sleep for at least seven hours daily.
4. have a balanced diet, nutritionally rich in proteins, vitamins and other vital nutrients.
5. bring their own water bottles from home.
6. avoid consumption of ice-creams and eatables from road side vendors.
7. are dewormed at least once every year. Regular advice to be taken from the family physician for their general state of good health.
8. get dental and eye check-up every year by a dentist and an ophthalmologist respectively.
